Meet Our Staff




Captain Christopher Utecht




Officer Joseph Cashin




Since 2022, there has been a significant increase in calls for service from 976 in 2022 to 2549 in 2024. This represents an increase of 1573 calls for service or a 161.1% increase.




2024 shows an increase in the number of traffic crashes, traffic stops and traffic citations. This is due to the increase in coverage and enforcement.




The above graph represents the number of municipal citations issued in a 3-year span between 2022-2024.



The above graph represents the number of criminal arrests. 2024 shows 2 felony arrests and 8 misdemeanor arrests. This is a sharp increase from both 2022 and 2023.



From 2022 to 2024 there was an increase to 34 ambulance calls from 20. This can also be explained by the added hours and full-time coverage.



As part of our mission, we have significantly increased our property checks. We feel it it's important to our community stakeholders that we are checking their businesses. Our growth shows 156 checks in 2022 to 759 in 2024, a 385.6% increase in activity.

Notable Incidents



In November of 2024 a concrete truck driver decided to make an illegal Y-turn on Paradise near Whispering Pines. The driver backed into the ditch, striking and uprooting a tree hitting a utility pole causing damage. The driver then fled the scene of the crash Officer Cashin located the driver and issued citations for the event. The company agreed to pay for the damaged tree which was located on Private property.



In the summer of 2024, a subject who was intoxicated on illicit drugs, who was recently released from jail, started a shed on fire and resisted police apprehension. He was successfully arrested without further incident. This subject was charged with Arson and three counts of Burglary to Dwelling. We are thankful no one was injured in this event and that we were able to capture this person in a short time frame.



In fall of 2024, Officers were dispatched to a large grass fire that was out of control on a windy day. Newburg Fire department responded and was able to eventually extinguish the flames before the reaching the neighboring buildings.
