### Disposal / Recycling Reference Guide as of 01/01/2025

We recommend first checking with your local municipality to find what they accept as part of their curbside pickup or if they offer any special collection events / recycling alternatives.

What to do with	Best practice	Vendor Reference (fees may apply)
Appliances	When buying new appliances check with the retailer about removal of your old appliance.	1,2,3,4,18,19
Batteries Alkaline (AA, AAA, C, D, 9volt)	When dead, alkaline batteries can be place in household trash.	12,16
<ul> <li>Rechargeable (i.e. cell phone, power tools, batteries, camcorders, etc</li> </ul>	All rechargeable batteries can be recycled.	3,7,12
<ul> <li>Automotive and Boat Batteries</li> </ul>	State law requires vehicle battery retailers to accept used leadacid batteries at no charge when purchasing new.	3,12,19
Books	Donate if good condition, otherwise place in curbside recycling bin. Remove covers from hardcover books.	2, 6
Carpeting	Check local retails, otherwise contact your trash hauler or private landfill.	3,4
Clothing & Textiles	Donate, check with retailer on condition they will accept.	6,17
Electronics	When buying new electronics check with the retailer about recycling of your old device.	3,4,5,6.11,18,19
Fire Extinguishers	Never place in curbside recycling or trash.	8
Furniture, Mattresses, Boxsprings	Donate if good condition.	3,4,6,14,15
<ul><li>Lights</li><li>LED, Incandescent and Halogen Bulbs</li></ul>	Not considered hazardous, can be place in household trash.	-
• Fluorescent Tubes, CFL Bulbs	Check with retail stores or take to Hazardous Waste Drop-off Site.	7,16,19
Plastic Film & Bags	See the website to learn more about recycling plastics: www.plasticfilmrecycling.org	-
Propane Tanks ■ Refillable Tanks	Check with retails who sell or refill propane tanks.	-
■ Single-Use Cylinders	It is not recommended to place propane tanks in recycling bins or trash. Check with scrap metal recycling vendors.	8,19
Scrap Metal	Do not throw in curbside recycling bin. Check with any local private recycle companies.	1,2
Smoke Detectors	Check with manufacture (label on back of detector) for possible recycling and mail back option. Otherwise wrap detector in paper, then wrap in plastic and throw in trash.	-
Televisions	When buying new electronics check with the retailer about recycling of your old device.	2,4,11,19
Tires	Check with retail store that sells tires or local service garage.	3,9
