2025 Use of Force Incidents



The Trenton Police Department considers anything between an escort hold to use of deadly force a trackable incident. The US Federal Government and State of Wisconsin consider trackable use of force incidents any of the following:

- An officer utilizes force that results in the death of a person
- An officer utilizes force that results in the great bodily harm of a person
- An officer discharges a firearm at or in the direction of a person
- A person dies while detained, arrested, or in the course of being arrested.

The Trenton Police Department has not had a federal or state reportable use of force incident since the tracking program was introduced. Beyond internal tracking methods, our officers are required to complete a use of force and arrest related death form called a UFAD. This report is completed monthly and submitted to the State of Wisconsin via the Badger TRaCS portal.

A detailed analysis of all contacts made with our officers shows there haven't any reportable use of force incidents for calendar year 2025.

Training and On-Going Education



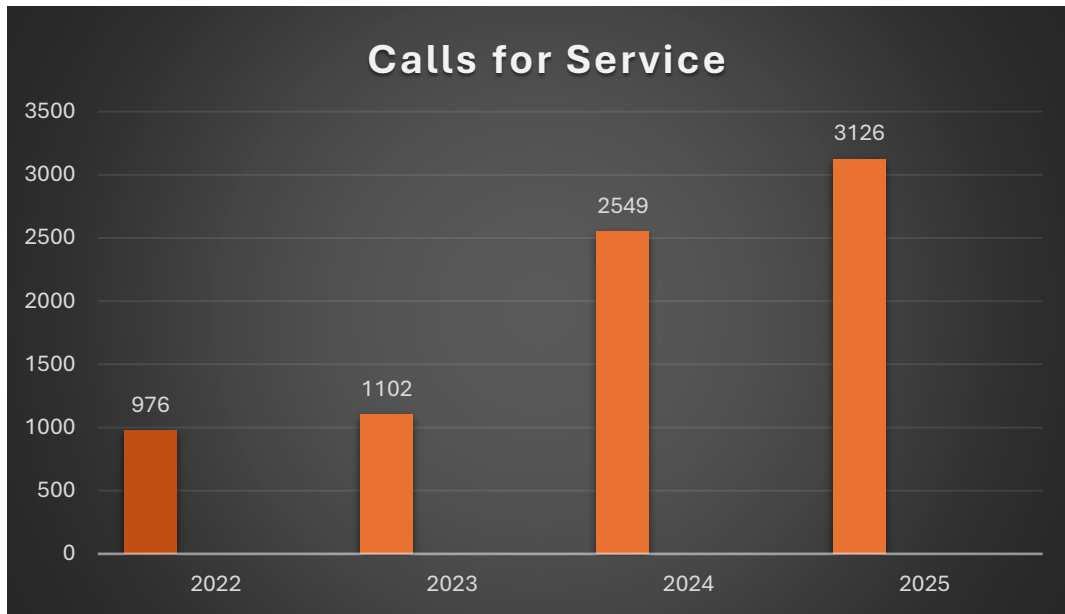
Wisconsin Training and Standards Bureau require that all officers in the State of Wisconsin complete 24 hours of in service training annually. Instructors in specialized disciplines require additional training and instructor updates.

Nearly all training within the Trenton Police Department is conducted in-house. This approach is made possible by our highly trained officers, many of whom are professional educators, allowing us to maintain high standards while directly addressing the needs of the community we serve. This is a highly budget conscious way to provide high quality training without the need to utilize a payment-based teaching service.

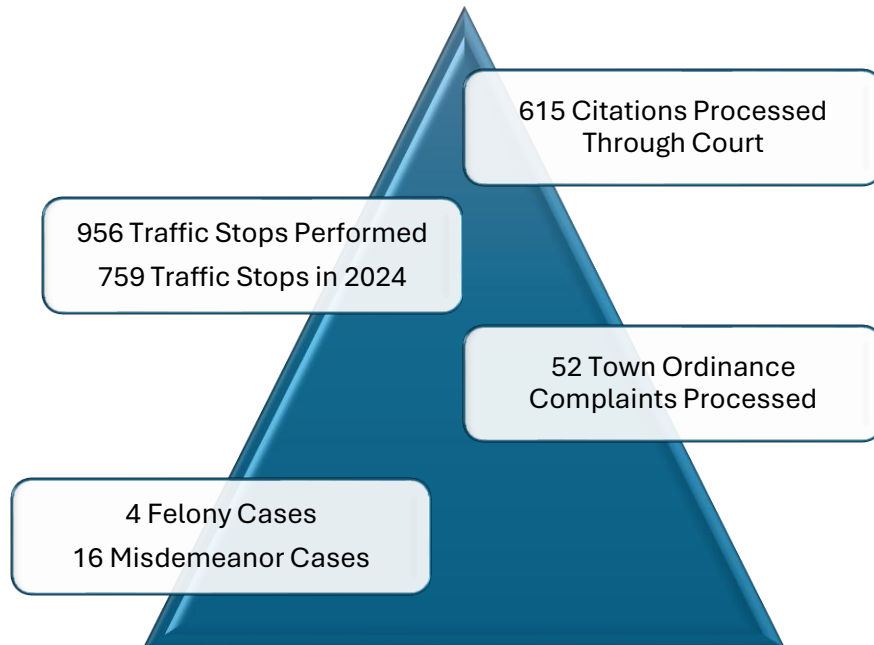
We instruct our officers in-house in the following topics:

2025 Activity



As you can see 2025 shows a significant increase in calls for service, both self-initiated and dispatched calls.



In 2025 the Trenton PD processed 615 citations through Municipal Court. 4 Felony cases and 16 misdemeanor cases were referred to the District Attorney's Office.

Strategic Goals for 2026

The Trenton Police Department will continue to advance public safety through proactive policing strategies, responsible technology investments, and strong community partnerships. In 2026, the Department's strategic goals will focus on visibility, transparency, and crime prevention while maintaining fiscal responsibility and community trust.

Increased Patrol Presence and Proactive Policing

The Department will emphasize increased patrol visibility throughout the community as a proactive measure to deter criminal activity and enhance public reassurance. Officers will dedicate additional time to directed patrols in residential neighborhoods and commercial areas, reinforcing a consistent and visible presence throughout the Town of Trenton.

Crime Stoppers Door Hanger Program

To further support crime prevention and community involvement, the Department has implemented a **Crime Stoppers door hanger program**. This initiative will promote citizen awareness, encourage the reporting of suspicious behavior, and provide residents and businesses with clear guidance on how to partner effectively with law enforcement. The program is designed to strengthen communication and reinforce shared responsibility for community safety.

Expanded Business Checks and Community Engagement

Routine business checks will continue and expand, with particular attention to after-hours inspections and high and low-traffic commercial locations. These proactive contacts serve as both a deterrent to criminal behavior and an opportunity to build and maintain positive relationships with local business owners, ensuring concerns are addressed promptly and collaboratively.

Implementation of In-Squad Camera Systems

The Department will pursue the acquisition and deployment of in-squad camera systems for patrol vehicles. In-squad cameras will enhance officer safety, improve documentation of traffic stops and enforcement activities, and support accountability by providing objective evidence. This technology will complement existing practices and further strengthen professional policing standards.

Enhancement of the Body-Worn Camera Program

Building on the Department's commitment to transparency and integrity, efforts will continue to improve and modernize the body-worn camera program. The Department is actively pursuing grant opportunities to upgrade equipment, improve data management capabilities, and ensure long-term reliability while minimizing costs to local taxpayers.

Responsible Use of Grant Funding

Consistent with the Department's budget-conscious approach, priority will be placed on securing grant funding and donations to support technology enhancements and public safety initiatives. Leveraging external funding sources will allow the Department to modernize operations while preserving Town resources for other essential services.
